

Responsible stewardship

Since September includes New Zealand Clean Up Week and October includes the feast of St Francis of Assisi, it seems a good time to reflect on our calling as Christians to care for all creation.

The Bible calls us to be stewards of the earth. We humans do not own the world or any part of it. "The earth is the Lord's, and the fullness thereof; the world, and they that dwell therein," said the psalmist. The early writer of Leviticus heard God saying, "The land is mine; for you are strangers and sojourners with me." We humans are guests and stewards here, not owners.

We often quote John 3:16 as a summary of the way for getting to heaven: "God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believes in him should not perish but have everlasting life." We sometimes overlook the importance of those first five words: "God so loved the world." Christ emerged from God's love for the world, not God's love for a new world, a perfect world, or a redeemed world, but the world as it was and is. Belief in Christ is all about belief in the inherent preciousness of the world.

So when we destroy nature, as humanity has done time and again, we are flinging God's gifts into God's face. The Bible gives us permission to use the gifts of nature but not to ruin or waste them. In the biblical view we are holy creatures living among holy creatures in a world that is holy.

What is a holy place for you? Christianity has sometimes nurtured the idea that the only holy place is the church. We think of the church building as God's house. But Jesus taught that God is present in all places to hear our prayers and accept our worship. St Paul preaching in Athens, said, "God that made the world and all living things dwells not in temples made with hands." God lives in the heart of all creation. Nature is food for the body, beauty for the eyes, and nourishment for the spirit. Nature is the harmony of silence and sound, forming a single whole. For our own happiness and wellbeing we must recognise our oneness with all creation. We live in a web of unity, and the world is full of the glory of God!

Something will have gone out of us as a people if we do not love and protect creation, and that something will be our soul. If our actions as a species can destroy, they can also heal. To truly know that we are not independent, self-enclosed beings, but rather dependent upon the environment in which we live, can transform us. Such an understanding and a care for all creation helps nurture in each one of us a deeper wisdom and reverence of the soul.




Bazaar and Flower Show
