

### Light in the darkness - holding onto the power of Easter

There is a risk as we celebrate Easter, knowing in advance the outcome of the drama. We are in danger of not being shocked by this unimaginably joyous, unprecedented event. If we are not careful, Easter can become just another one of those stories with a feel-good, happy ending, rather than a stunning event that should make the hair on the back of our necks stand up when we hear the Good News.

Familiarity can breed, if not contempt, at least a ho-hum, of-course-he-rose-on-the-third-day kind of attitude. If we give in to this familiar thinking, Jesus' death on the cross is hardly a life-changing gift, but rather a short pause in a celebration lined only with chocolate eggs and family dinners.

In the depth of our faith, we cannot afford to become so complacent. It is important that we understand Easter profoundly and appreciate its ultimate value; important that we remember that it follows and gives meaning to the grim weight of Good Friday.

Easter is about coming face to face with a Jesus who has not just reversed the power death, but has completely triumphed over it. The Good News of the Resurrection is that Christ is a light that overcomes all the darkness that life can entail. That light overcomes the darkness we experience in Holy Week when we pass through vivid reminders of our human frailty and sin, reminders of how easy it is for us to be gobbled up by the power of the enemies of God.

We have the love and light of Christ going before us and living within us. That light helps illuminate our way forth in life, and we should strive to bring that love and light to the darker parts of our world. We can go forth with confidence because we know that Christ goes before us into all the world.

Christ leads the way for us, always going before us, raising us with him from the depths: from sickness and pain and even death, from disappointment and sin and despair and grief. Christ goes before us as our light in the darkness, allowing us to reflect his light into the world. Alleluia!

#### AMB 2023 Lenten Appeal

The Anglican Missions Board's annual Lenten appeal calls the church to give sacrificially both financially and through prayer. Each year, AMB raises funds for three projects that directly contribute to the health, wellbeing and development of the communities and people involved.

This year the AMB is supporting projects in:

- Fiji, the Mud Brick Project When cyclones strike, homes in Fiji are the first to fall. Mud Bricks are an innovative solution to create resilient, cyclone-proof housing. This project empowers local villages through brick production, creating houses that can weather the devastating effects of climate change.
- Northern Ethiopia, the Bricks for Life project This innovative project provide a number of incredible foundational services for the people of this poor region, from grain mills, water tanks, irrigation, feminine hygiene access and even a soap making business.
- the Middle East, the School Heating Project All students deserve an environment to learn in that is safe, healthy and physically suited to help them thrive. Many classrooms around the world do not have adequate heating or cooling systems to achieve this. the AMB is making safe and healthy classrooms a reality for Saviour's School in Zarqa, Jordan.

We feel the mother's loss As, weeping and forlorn, She gazes at the cross. 'This is my child.'


As, smashed on any road, Or washed up on a shore, She sees her precious load. 'This is my child.'



Purple Poppy Day Service

Purple Poppy Day is observed on 24 February and was introduced in 2006 to commemorate the animals that served, and continue to serve, during wartime. Animals have often been the forgotten casualties of war, for example approximately eight million horses and donkeys (that were critical for hauling supplies and artillery) died during the First World War. Dogs and carrier pigeons have been among the other animals involved in war efforts, with many earning medals for acts saving the lives of soldiers and civilians.

Woodville held its third Purple Poppy Service this year, and had a Police dog and his handler, ponies and local dogs join the Mayor and community members in honouring the animals that have given so much to help in times of war and conflict.
