An Uncertain Advent

It has been a strange few months, with COVID's Delta variant in the community and the different lockdowns and protocols that have been in place. In all this New Zealand is lucky, as a first world nation we have enough vaccine does to go around (the challenge is getting everyone vaccinated). In Africa to date there have been only enough vaccine doses delivered for 5% of the continent's population. Our duty as a global Church and a nation is to help those less fortunate, especially in such uncertain times.

We shortly start the season of Advent, a time of preparation and expectation, that first grew out of uncertainty. Mary and Joseph faced enormous uncertainty from the moment of the annunciation when Mary learnt she was to carry the God made flesh. While the focus in our church calendar is contained in a month, for Mary and Joseph the pregnancy was of course the usual nine months of change. Then there were the years of raising Jesus. His childhood and early years are glossed over in the New Testament, apart from a few small incidents, but his earthly ministry didn't start until around 30. In all that time Mary and Joseph must have watched with a sense of expectation as Jesus grew and matured, unsure what his role on earth was to be.

We are faced with these aspects of God beyond all comprehension, someone both infinite and also familiar with human timescales. Like Mary and Joseph we need to try and give our uncertainty and worries over to God. I know it is easy to say that, but of course it is so hard in practice, something I know I struggle with. But the value lies in trying, in being alert to the moment, taking the steps we can, but not worrying about the things beyond our control or influence. We are enfolded in God's love. Things may not be easy, indeed they can be frustrating, painful, sorrowful, but we do not bear them alone.

The troubles we face now will eventually pass, although that makes them no easier to bear now. But we are a community, both with each other and with the one we follow. God is a light to us, and we can be a light to others, a light of the world like that star from long ago. The power, warmth, and support of community can overcome darkness and despair. We will worry for the future, we are human, but as Christian's we're blessed with knowing that none of us is alone, that we have a God that cares for us, and knows us more completely than we will ever know ourselves. And we're blessed with a God who loves us – loves us so much that he accepted human life in all its messy uncertainty and lived with us in a full, rich human life.

In the name of that life, of the Christ Child, I wish you a blessed Advent and Christmas season, Rosie

The organisers would like to thank all the musicians, singers, and everyone who attended and helped raise a great sum for a very worthy cause.
